# Why we're here:

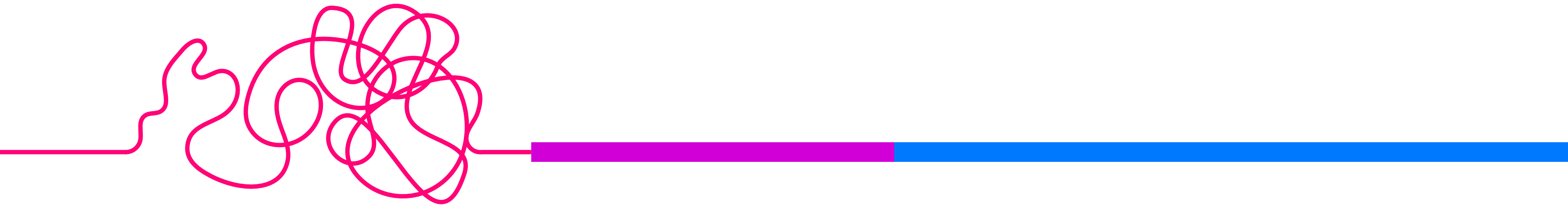

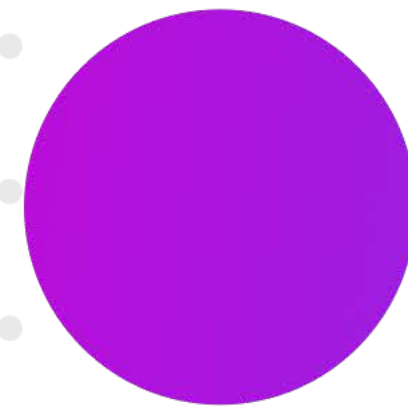
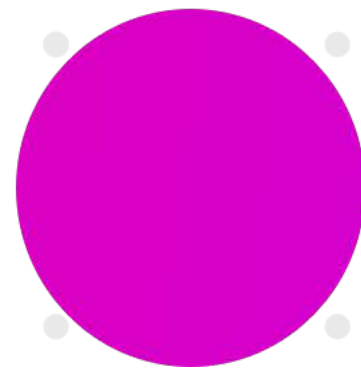
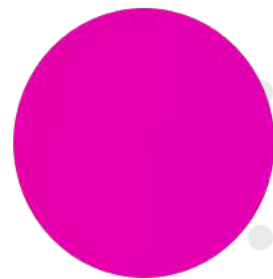


# We'll be successful if...

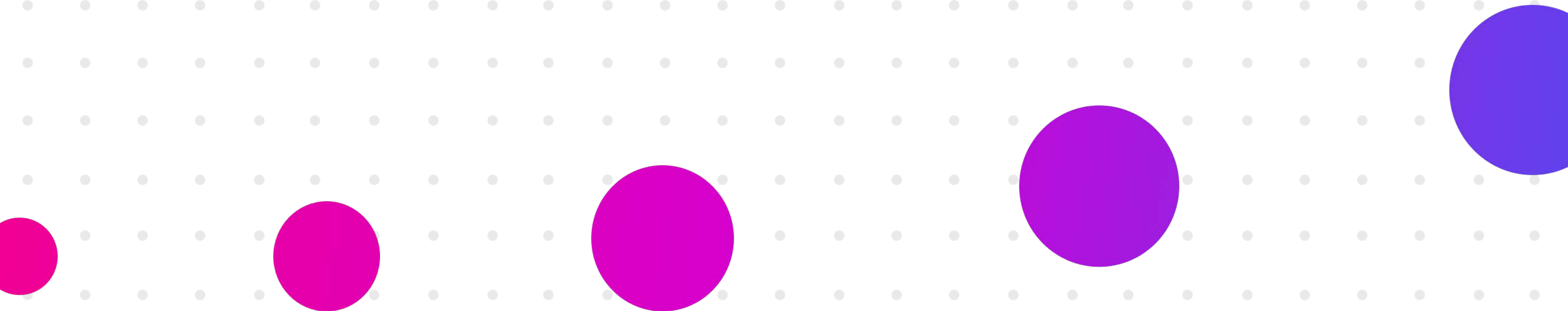

# Why a Stage Gate approach?



- It's a starting point
- Establishes a structured approach
- Creates checks and balances through natural check-ins and leadership visibility



# Stage Gate

**Stage:** where the work is done and the questions are answered

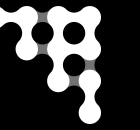
**Gate:** where decisions are made (not a status meeting)





# Stages from Intent Workshop



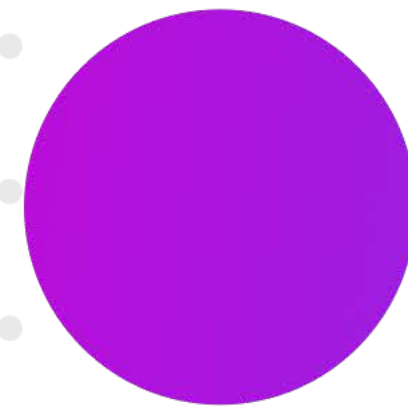
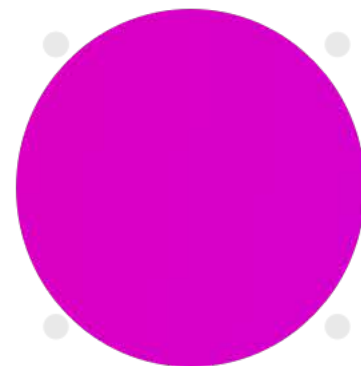
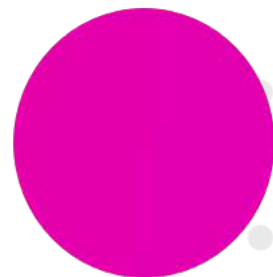


# Stage Intent

**Example:** In this stage, teams should be identifying user problems and conducting rapid test and learn cycles to determine what initial desirable ideas(s) could solve those problems, and measuring against decision criteria

# Gate Decisions

**Go:** the work is on-track, move to the next Stage

**No/Go (Kill):** there doesn't appear to be enough evidence to move forward. Stop working, no more resources for the initiative

**Recycle:** there are still unanswered questions or more work to be done. Stay in the current Stage and come back to the Gate later

**Hold:** there's interest in the work, but it's not a priority for the moment. Capture any learnings, and hold off any more work for the time being. The initiative might be revived at a later date.

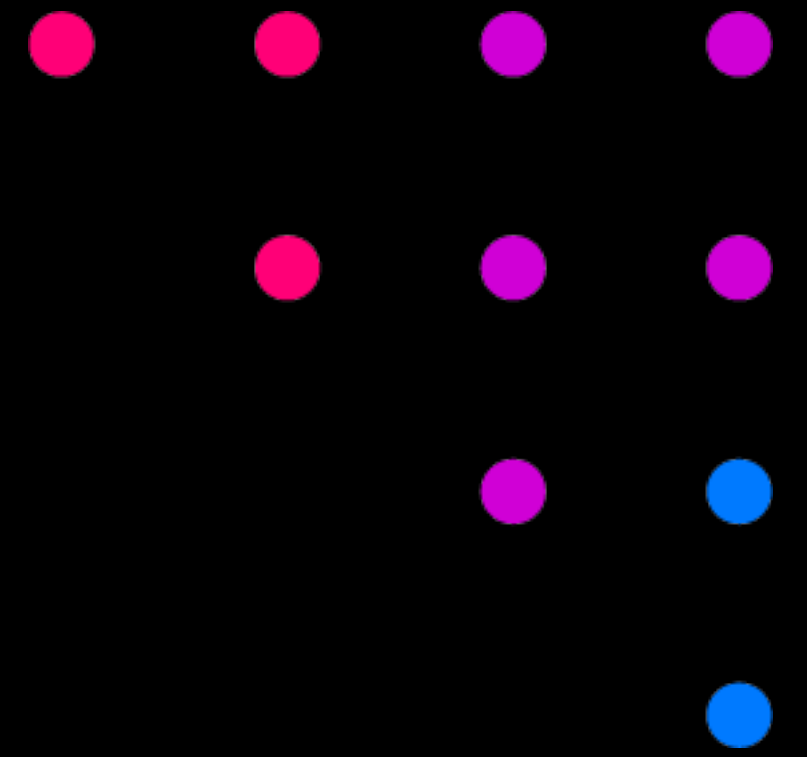

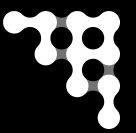
